**Subject: Findings Required by AB 361 for the Continued Use of Teleconferencing for Meetings**

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### **SUMMARY**

For the Traffic Commission to continue to have the option to meet via teleconference during the pandemic, AB 361 requires the Traffic Commission to make specific findings at least every thirty (30) days.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

Make the following findings by a majority vote of the Traffic Commission:

1. A state of emergency has been proclaimed by California's Governor due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and continues to be in effect;
2. The Traffic Commission has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and
3. State and local officials continue to recommend measures to promote social distancing to slow the spread of COVID-19.

### **BACKGROUND**

Assembly Bill 361 (AB 361) was signed into law by the Governor on September 16, 2021. A portion of AB 361 enacted amendments to California Government Code section 54953 regarding teleconference meetings. Those amendments authorize local agencies, like the City, to continue to conduct meetings by teleconference during a Governor-proclaimed state of emergency provided that certain findings are made by the legislative body, and provided that certain procedural requirements are met regarding public access to the meetings. A "teleconference" occurs for purposes of AB 361 whenever one or more members of the City Council connect to a City Council meeting via electronic means. Thus, even if four members of the City Council meet in person, if the fifth joins the meeting via Zoom, the meeting will be a teleconference meeting that must be conducted in accordance with the requirements of AB 361. For purposes of AB 361 "...state of emergency' means a state of emergency proclaimed pursuant to Section 8625 of the California Emergency Services Act..." Cal. Gov't Code Sec. 54953(e)(4). Section 8265 of CESA in turn refers to a state of emergency proclaimed by the Governor.

A new requirement in AB 361 requires specific findings be reaffirmed at least every thirty (30)

days in order for the Traffic Commission to continue to have the option for one (1) or more of its members to use teleconferencing.

## **DISCUSSION**

### Required Findings

The teleconference provisions in AB 361 may only be utilized as long as a Governor-proclaimed state of emergency remains active, or while state or local officials have recommended measures to promote social distancing. When either of those is the case (both are true at this time), then in order to continue to teleconference using the new provisions of AB 361, the Traffic Commission must make the following findings by majority vote every 30 days:

(A) The Traffic Commission has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and

(B) Either of the following circumstances exist:

1. The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person; or
2. State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing (Cal Gov't Code Sec. 54953(e)(3)).

To comply with that requirement, the recommended action would have the Traffic Commission find each of the following:

1. A state of emergency has been proclaimed by California's Governor due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and continues to be in effect;
2. The Traffic Commission has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and
3. State and local officials continue to recommend measures to promote social distancing to slow the spread of COVID-19.

### The "Every 30 Days Thereafter" Requirement

As noted above, AB 361 findings must be made "no later than 30 days after teleconferencing for the first time pursuant to , and every 30 days thereafter..."

In order to preserve the option for the Traffic Commission or individual members of the Traffic Commission to participate in meetings during the pandemic via teleconference in the future, the Traffic Commission will have to adopt the required findings at least every 30 days.

### Potential Consequence of Not Making the Findings Every 30 Days

AB 361 does not expressly state what happens if a legislative body fails to make the required findings "every 30 days." However, it expressly requires the timely re-approval of the findings "in order to continue to teleconference" in the manner that AB 361 authorizes.

As a result, if the Traffic Commission does not adopt the required findings every 30 days, then

the Traffic Commission could be precluded from continuing to teleconference thereafter, perhaps even if the Traffic Commission was later willing to adopt the findings at a later date. For this reason, the City Attorney recommends that the Traffic Commission adopt the required findings at this time and at least every 30 days thereafter, unless the Traffic Commission decides as a permanent matter that it will no longer permit teleconferencing at all (e.g., regardless of whether the state of emergency worsens).

#### Procedural Requirements for The Conduct of Teleconference Meetings

AB 361 contains several new requirements for the conduct of teleconference meetings with which the City has prepared to comply. Specifically, each meeting must:

1. Allow members of the public to attend and comment at the meeting via call-in option or internet-based service option;
2. Protect the statutory and constitutional rights of the parties and the public appearing before the legislative body;
3. In the event of disruption which prevents broadcasting the meeting or which prevents members of the public from offering public comments via the call-in or internet-based option, the Traffic Commission must take no further action until the disrupted public access is restored;
4. The City may not require public comments to be submitted in advance, and must offer the opportunity for the public to offer comments “in real time” during the meeting; and
5. The public must be allowed “a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow members of the public to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register , or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.

### **A. Street Improvement Project - Phase II**

Development Services Director Noda summarized the staff report.

Commissioner Murphy asked about the project currently occurring on Oak Street. Development Services Director Noda confirmed that OC San will complete their work on Oak Street before the Street Improvement Project takes place.

Chair R. Hill asked about the ADA issues that will be taken care of. Development Services Director Noda clarified that if there are any ADA issues in the location of a project, then it will be fixed. Should the Commissioners have any area of concern then it will be noted.

Commissioner Mejia asked if restriping could be included in this project. Development Services Director Noda shared that at the June City Council meeting, there will be Capital Improvement Project discussed of a fiscal year 22/23 striping project.

Commissioner Mejia shared the following areas that need to be restriped: Florista Street - crosswalk on Kyle Street and the angled parking striping on Pine Street. He then suggested having raised reflectors on the right turn only areas at the intersection of Los Alamitos Blvd. and Florista Avenue. Commissioner Mejia also shared his thoughts on restriping the intersection at Bloomfield Street and Katella Avenue.

Development Services Director Noda shared that the crosswalk at Bloomfield Street and Katella Avenue will be completed before school starts again and that the crosswalk at Chestnut Street and Katella Avenue will be striped.

Commissioner Mejia added the stop does not have a stop bar at Lexington Drive and Farquhar Avenue, Development Services Director Noda clarified that this portion might in the jurisdiction of the Joint Forces Training Base.

Vice Chair Patz shared that the new stop signs at Florista Street still do not work.

Development Services Director Noda confirmed that the Public Works Division is slated to get the work done in July.

Commissioner Murphy asked about the stop signs that were not placed in the correct area.

Development Services Director Noda clarified that it will be fixed too with the help of Traffic Engineer Iranitalab.
